

Supervision Skills for Complex Cases

This workshop is aimed at therapy supervisors in the statutory, voluntary and private sector

Supervisees will naturally turn to their supervisors for help with their most complex cases. Cases may be complex due to the client's multiple mental health issues, level of risk, or intensity of feeling provoked in the client or the system. This workshop aims to increase the confidence of the supervisor by taking a systematic approach to these issues. Senior NHS clinical supervisors draw on their experiences of supervising the multi-disciplinary team and individual therapists with their most challenging cases.

Dr Maggie Stanton is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist heading a team of psychological therapists in the NHS. She supervises clinicians from a range of professions as well as lecturing and supervising at the University of Southampton on the CBT Diploma and the Doctorate in Clinical Psychology.

Christine Dunkley is an advanced practitioner in psychological therapy, BACP Senior Accredited Practitioner and qualified supervisor. She supervises the local CMHT complex case team and in primary care. She has written a number of articles on supervision for the BACP journal. She is on the national Dialectical Behaviour Therapy training team.

Both clinicians have over 20 years experience in the NHS.
