## Therapy with Violent Perpetrators Presented by Dr Gwen Adshead

In this talk, Dr Adshead will discuss the psychological individual roots of violence and the implications for changing violent minds. She will discuss work with different kinds of violence perpetrator, both male and female; and in both group and individual work. She will discuss the implications for the therapist in terms of risk assessment and managing our own feelings in the work.

**Dr Gwen Adshead is** Consultant Forensic psychiatrist and psychotherapist. She has worked as a therapist in secure settings for over 15 years, most recently at Broadmoor Hospital. Gwen is a group therapist and trained in mindfulness based cognitive therapy. She has run therapeutic groups for men and women with severe personality disorders who have committed offences against other people. She has also worked in two trauma clinics with refugees and survivors of acts of violence. Gwen holds a master's degree in medical law and ethics from Kings University London; and has a long standing interest in psychiatric ethics; especially in relation to psychotherapy and forensic psychiatry. She has published over 100 books, book chapters and papers; and is currently working on a textbook of psychotherapy for Oxford University Press.
